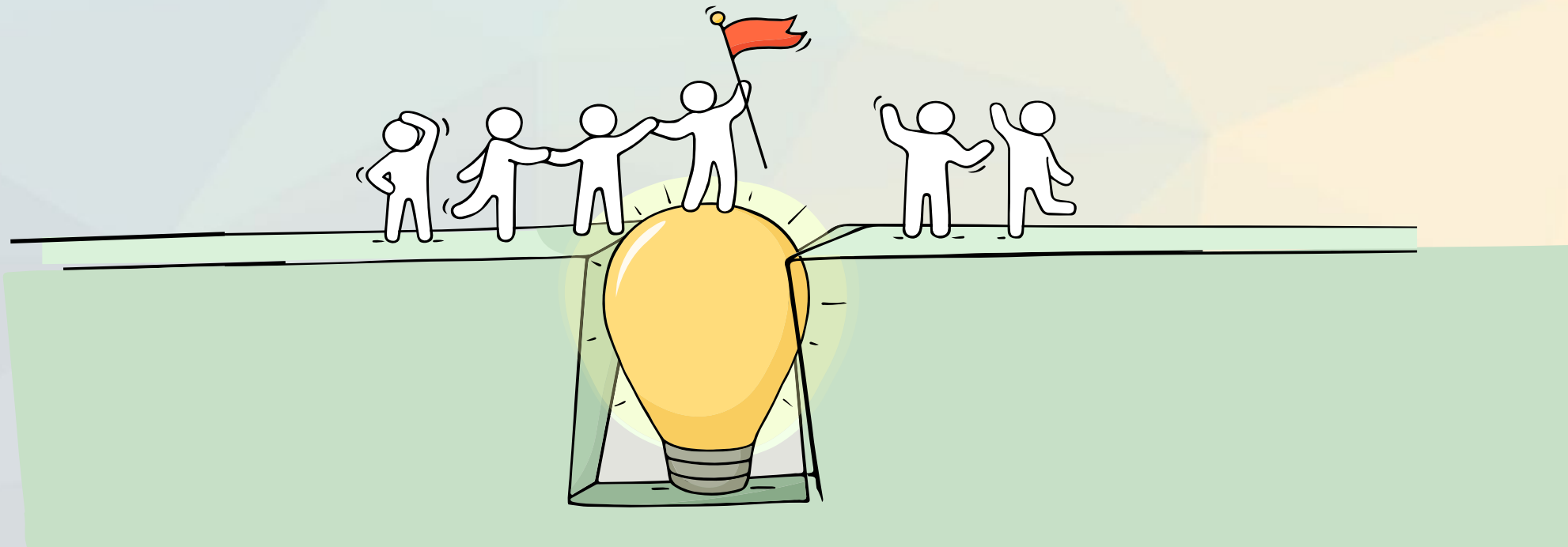
Remember that **everyone's learning journey is different** but **we can each have a fulfilling outcome!**



Many pathways and opportunities!

Reaching out for help is a sign of strength, not weakness

If you have any concerns or are not coping, do reach out to someone you trust and speak with them. It could be a parent/guardian, teacher, School Counsellor or a friend that you can talk to.



Supporting Your Friend

We may each experience different emotions upon receiving the results. You can share your friends' joy by congratulating them or give words of encouragement to friends who may be disappointed with their results.



Keep a lookout for your friends in distress. You can support them in the following ways:

Calm them down

“Are you ok? Calm down, take a few deep breaths.”

Hear them out

“I am here to listen to you.” or “I am here for you.”

Empathise with them

“It sounds like you are disappointed.” or “It seems like this is a difficult time for you.”

Encourage seeking help

“Thanks for sharing. Why don't we speak with a trusted adult who can help?”

Refer your friend to a trusted adult

“Let's talk to our teacher or our School Counsellor so they can better support you. Do share your feelings with your parents/guardians too. Would you like me to accompany you?”



Concerned about your next steps?

Stop

- Calm yourself down. Take a few deep breaths.

Think

- Think through the different options that are available for you. Keep things in perspective.
- Remember that the N-Level is one part of your life journey and not the destination.

Do

- Approach a trusted adult and seek his/her help. Have a conversation with this person about what would be best for you.
- Make a decision and take action based on your options.

When you receive your results, you may experience a range of emotions.

Managing these emotions well will allow you to stay calm and make rational decisions.

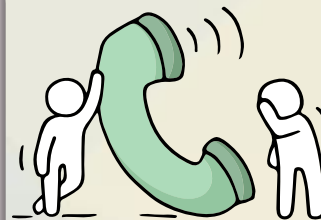

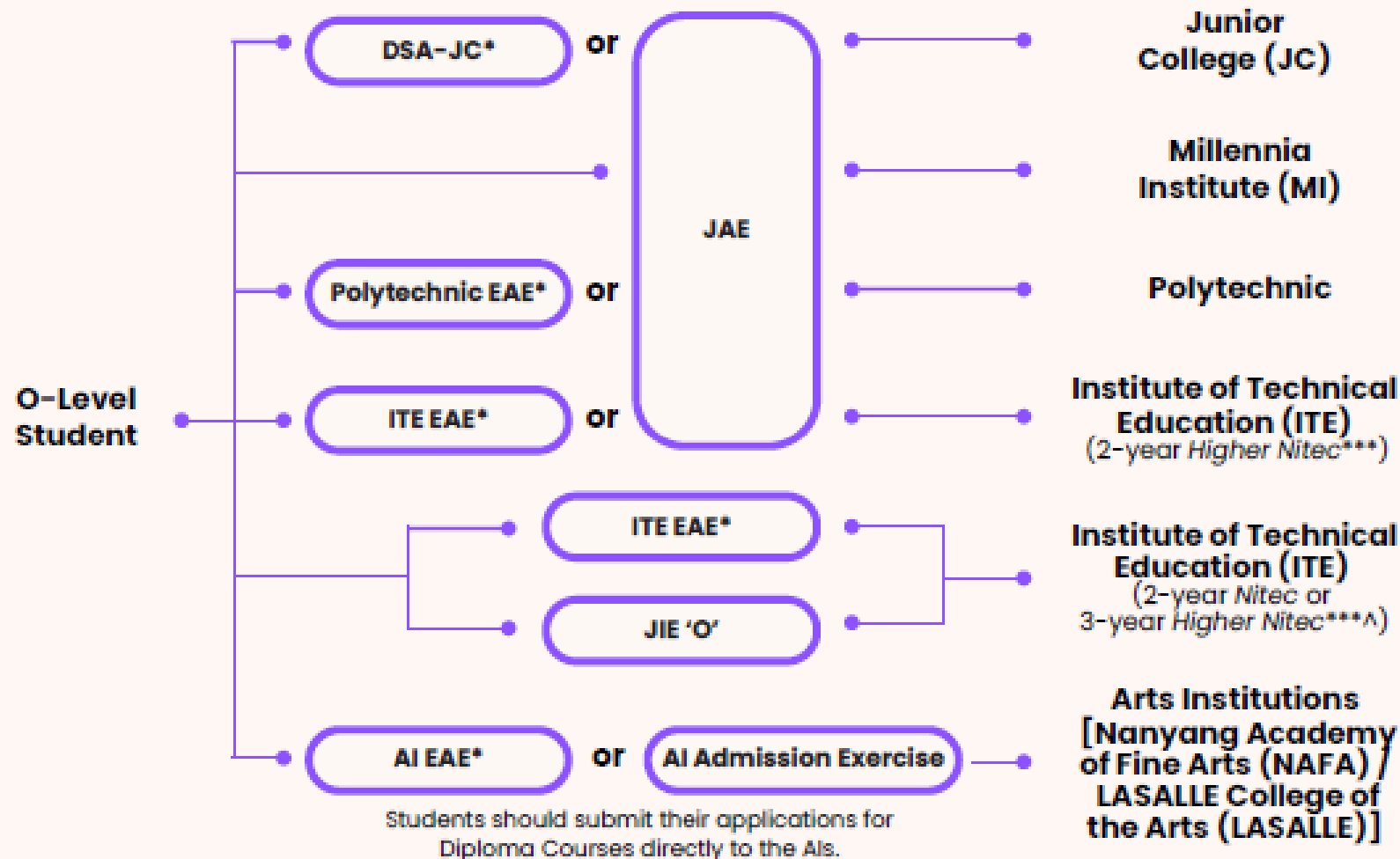

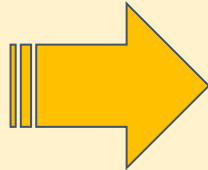


Criteria for Conditional Admission

If you did not obtain the minimum grade, you are eligible for conditional admission when you meet one of the following:

JC

- Gross L1R5 \leq 15
- Gross L1R5 from 16 to 20, and have grades of A1 or A2 in all the 5 relevant subjects

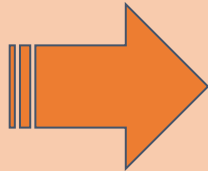


Students who did not meet the minimum required grade

- Must resit for the subject and obtain required grade by the end of JC Year 1
- Failing which he/she will be transferred to the 2nd Year of MI.
- By the end of Year 2 in MI, if he/she still does not obtain the required grade, he/she will have to leave the MI course.

MI

- Gross L1R4 \leq 15
- Gross L1R4 from 16 to 20, and have grades of A1 or A2 in all the 4 relevant subjects



- Must resit for the subject and obtain the required grade by the end of Year 1 in MI
- Failing which he/she will be given another year to obtain the requisite grades (either Year 1 or Year 2, depending on whether student pass internal exam).

Net Aggregate Score

- **Net** score = **Gross** score (Form A) **minus bonus points**

Course Choices & Order

Vacancies Available in the Courses



- **Academic Merit** is the first criterion.
- Applicants with **Lower Net Score** will be considered for admission **first**.
- This is then followed by order of course choices by the applicant, subject to vacancies remaining.

Note: Priority is given to **eligible applicants** (based on MER) who chose NYP or NP's **Diploma in Nursing** as **FIRST choice**

Jane is considered for posting first to ASRJC

Based on Jane's net aggregate score (11 pts) being lower than John's score (12 pts), and this is despite ranking ASRJC as 3rd choice as compared to John's 1st choice.

Direct School Admissions (DSA) - JC

Students who had accepted offers through the 2024 Direct School Admission – Junior Colleges (DSA-JC) will be admitted to their chosen JC if they have met the eligibility criteria for admission based on their GCE O-Level examination results.

Students admitted to a JC through DSA-JC will not be eligible to participate in the JAE.

Students who do not meet the JC admission criteria may take part in the JAE to apply for other courses which they are eligible for.



Early Admissions Exercise (EAE) – Polytechnics

Students who had earlier accepted conditional offers to a polytechnic course through the Polytechnic Early Admissions Exercise (EAE) in 2024 will have their offers confirmed and will not be eligible to participate in the JAE, if they meet the following criteria:

1. A net ELR2B2 score of 26 points or lower for the GCE O-Level examinations; and
2. Minimum Entry Requirements for the respective polytechnic courses.

Students who do not meet the above criteria may still apply for polytechnic admission via the JAE for courses which they are eligible for.



Early Admissions Exercise (EAE) – ITE

Students who had accepted conditional offers to an ITE course through the ITE EAE in 2024 and have their offers confirmed based on their GCE O-Level examination results will not be eligible to participate in the JAE.

Their EAE offers are confirmed if they meet the subject-specific Minimum Entry Requirements for the course.



Polytechnic Foundation Programme (PFP)

Students are eligible to apply for the PFP if they obtain a raw ELMAB3 aggregate of 12 points or lower and meet the subject-specific requirements for their chosen course.

PFP-eligible students who had taken GCE O-Level subjects will receive a copy of **Form P**.

Each copy of Form P contains a unique password. Interested students should use the respective passwords to submit their applications online via the PFP website at <https://pfp.polytechnic.edu.sg/PFP/index.html>.

Applications for the PFP will be open from **1.30pm on Friday, 10 January 2025**, to **4.00pm on Wednesday, 15 January 2025**.

The PFP posting results will be released at **1.30pm on Wednesday, 22 January 2025** through the PFP website. **Students will thereafter be required to indicate whether they wish to accept, reject, or appeal for a change of course by 4.00pm on Monday, 27 January 2025.**



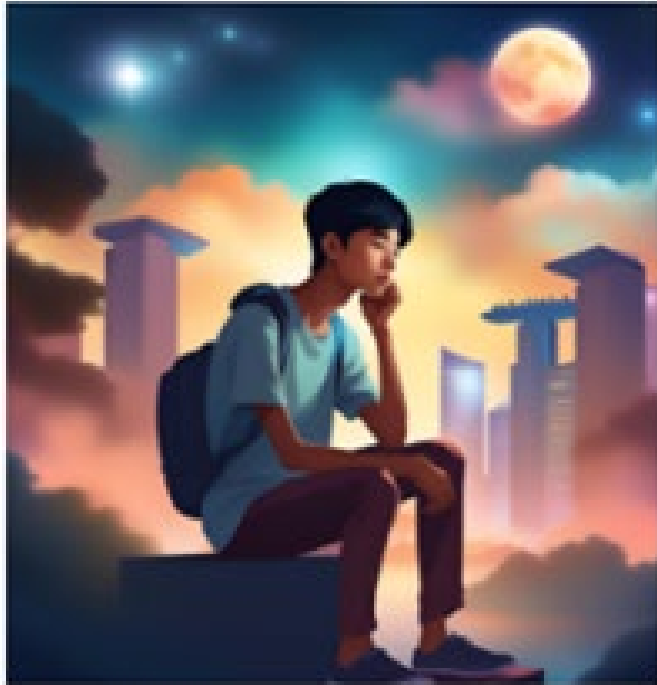
Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP)

Eligible Secondary 4 N(A) students may submit their DPP applications online via the DPP application portal at www.ite.edu.sg/apply-for-ite-courses. Applications for the DPP will open from 12.00am on Friday, 10 January 2025, to 11.59pm on Tuesday, 14 January 2025.

The DPP posting results for applications made under the final application phase will be released at 9.00am on Wednesday, 17 January 2025 through the DPP application portal. Students must indicate whether they accept or reject the offer by 11.59pm on Tuesday, 21 January 2025.

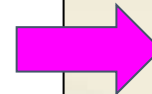

- May submit up to six polytechnic diploma and/or ITE 2-year *Higher Nitec* courses, where:
 - Student has met the course minimum entry requirements, and
 - Student's net aggregate score is equal to or better than that of the lowest-ranked applicant posted to the course
- **At end of combined appeals period, all unposted students will be offered a place in a polytechnic or ITE course with remaining vacancies, subject to the aforesaid conditions**



Direct Admissions Exercise (DAE)

- Refer to the various polytechnic websites for information on eligibility and requirements
- Application is to be made directly via the polytechnic websites
- 2 Phases. Phase 1 coincides with JAE application period. Phase 2 will be around end-February
- Some polytechnics **do not accept** applicants who are **eligible** to apply for polytechnic courses **via JAE**
- Placement is **NOT guaranteed** i.e. not a “back-up” option. Do participate in JAE

8 Things You Should Know Before You Enrol in A Private School

School Registration



Ensure the school is registered with CPE. Review the school's registration period, expiry date and its overall registration track record.

Partner Institution



Research on the partner institution conferring the diploma or degree, and whether the qualification is recognised by the industry.

EduTrust Certification Scheme

Is the school EduTrust-certified*? Under the scheme, private schools are assessed for their performance in areas such as school management and provision of student support services.



**Schools are required to obtain EduTrust certification in order to offer external degree programmes*

School Premises

Head down to the campus ground to check the facilities and support services. Observe the study environment too.



Fee Protection



Ask if there is any course fee protection so that you will be able to recover unconsumed course fees should the school close down.

Beyond Course fees



Find out about the course syllabus and materials, graduation rates and employment prospects. Approach the alumni to find out what they think of the school.

Teachers

Check if the teachers are qualified to teach the course.



Internship

If industry attachment is included, find out which organisation you will be attached to, the period of attachment and the alternative arrangement should the attachment become unavailable. Verify the information with the organisation as well.

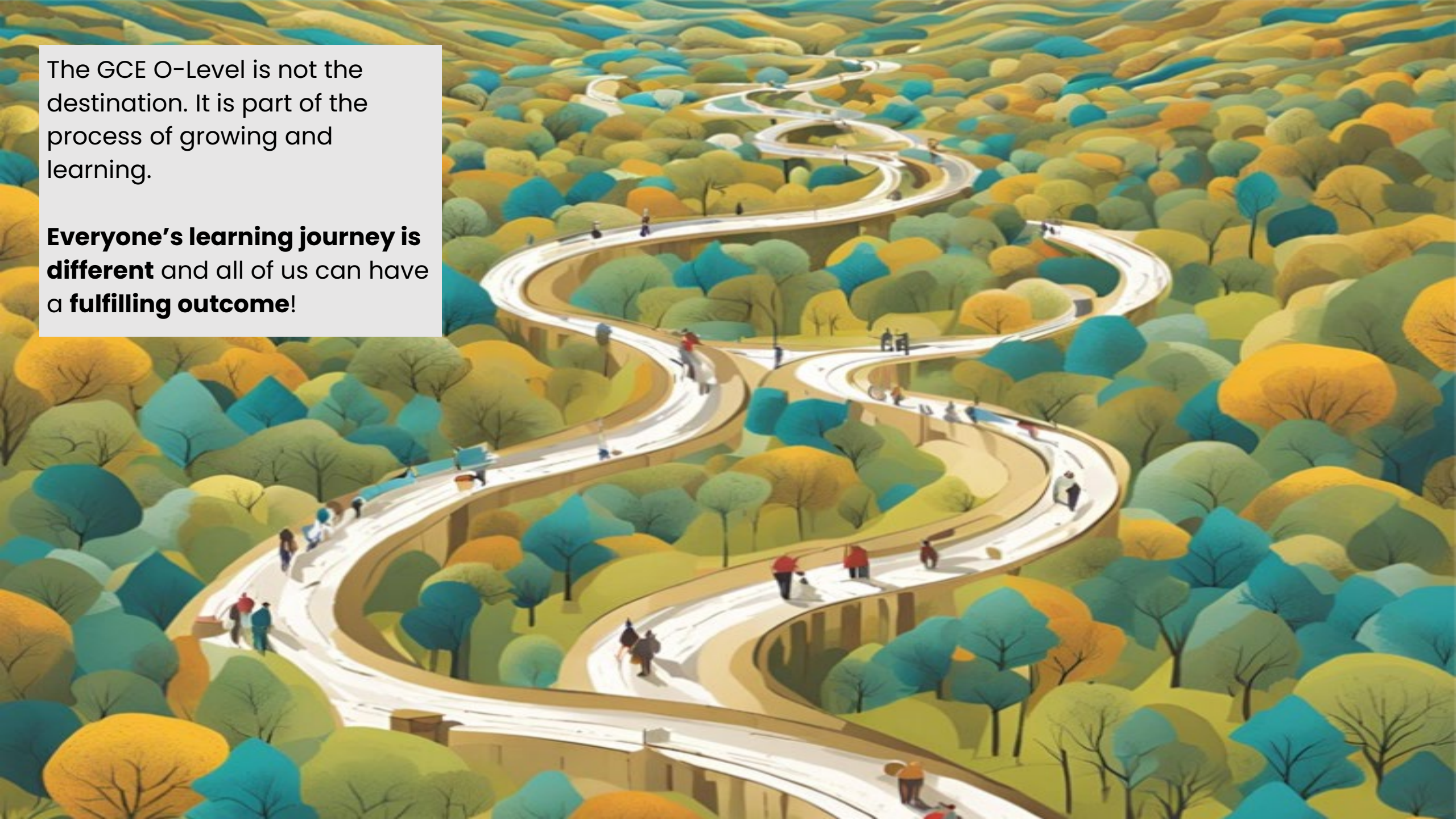
