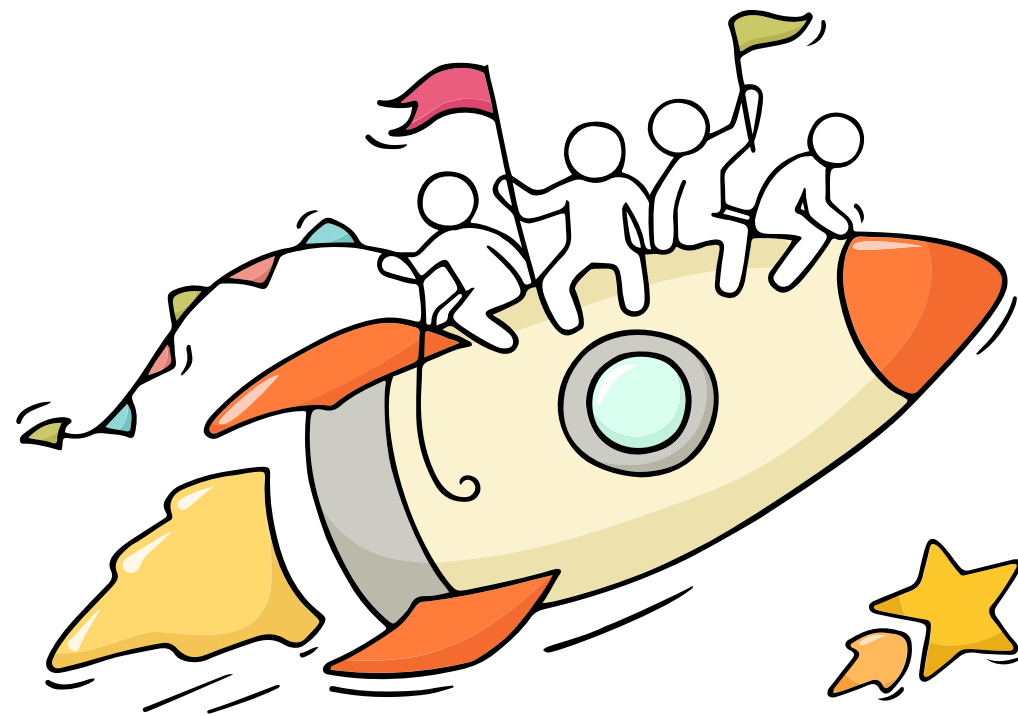

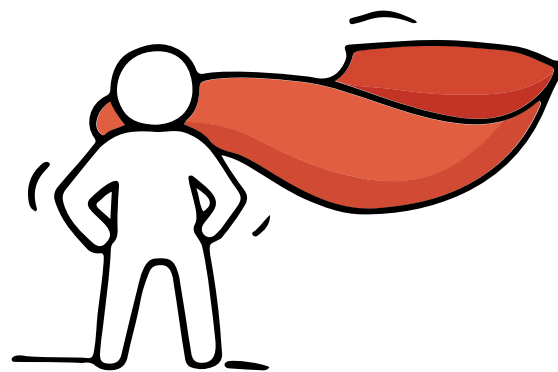

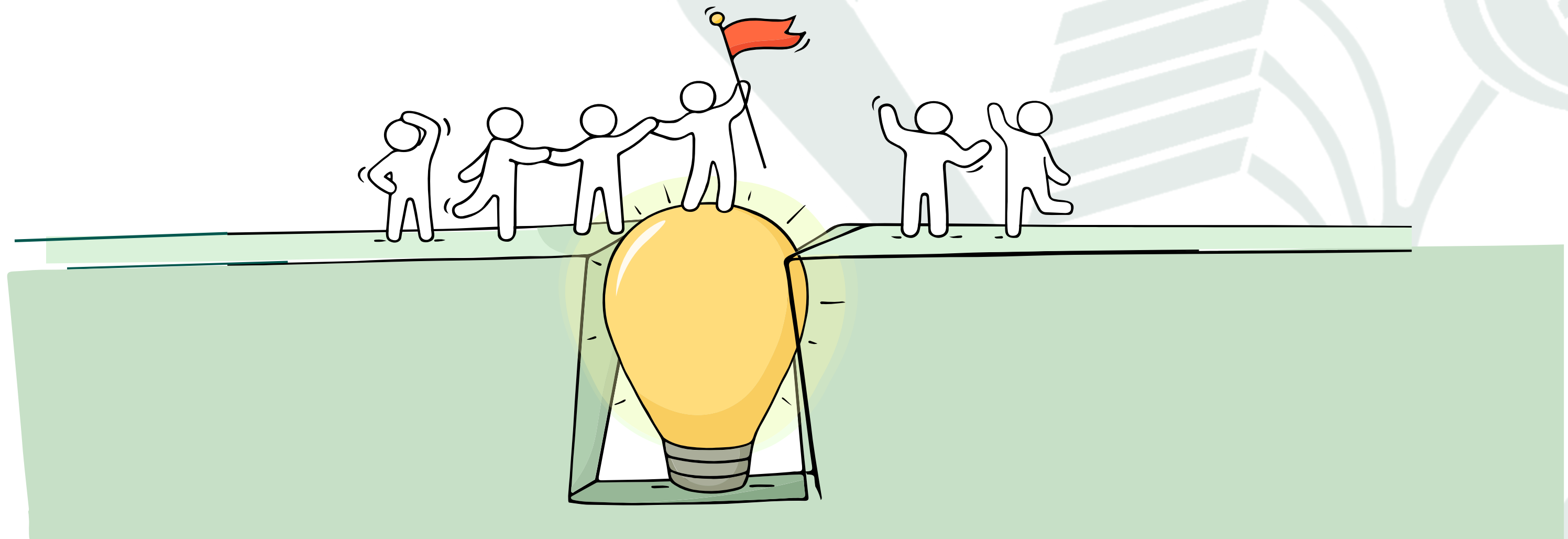

**Keep a lookout for your friends in distress. You can support them in the following ways:**

**Calm them down**

"Are you ok? Calm down, take a few deep breaths."

**Hear them out**

"I am here to listen to you." or "I am here for you."

**Empathise with them**

"It sounds like you are disappointed." or "It seems like this is a difficult time for you."

**Encourage seeking help**

"Thanks for sharing. Why don't we speak with a trusted adult who can help?"

**Refer your friend to a trusted adult**

"Let's talk to our teacher or our School Counsellor so they can better support you. Do share your feelings with your parents/guardians too. Would you like me to accompany you?"

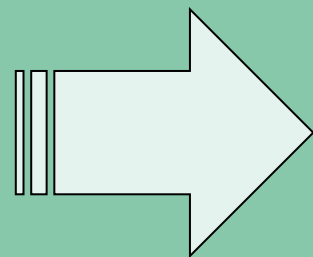
# Criteria for Conditional Admission

If you did not obtain the minimum grade, you are eligible for conditional admission when you meet one of the following:

## Students who did not meet the minimum required grade

### JC

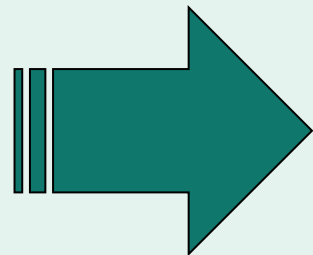
- Gross LIR5  $\leq 15$
- Gross LIR5 from 16 to 20, and have grades of A1 or A2 in all the 5 relevant subjects



- Must resit for the subject and obtain required grade by the end of JC Year 1
- Failing which he/she will be transferred to the 2nd Year of MI.
- By the end of Year 2 in MI, if he/she still does not obtain the required grade, he/she will have to leave the MI course.

### MI

- Gross LIR4  $\leq 15$
- Gross LIR4 from 16 to 20, and have grades of A1 or A2 in all the 4 relevant subjects



- Must resit for the subject and obtain the required grade by the end of Year 1 in MI
- Failing which he/she will be given another year to obtain the requisite grades (either Year 1 or Year 2, depending on whether student pass internal exam).

You will get an **additional 2 bonus points** if you have applied and got selected for Chinese/Malay/Tamil Elective Programmes at a JC. If you are admitted to these programmes, you must offer the respective subject and sit for its GCE A-Level examination. You are required to remain in the programme while studying in the JC. If not, you can be asked to leave the school.

**Bonus points applicable for JC application ranges from 1 to 4; Additional 2 bonus points for Chinese/Malay/Tamil Language Elective Programme (a total of 6 bonus points is possible)**

2. Meet **Minimum Entry Requirements (MERs)** of each course

Unlike JC/MI eligibility, CCA bonus points *can* be applied at this stage to determine polytechnic eligibility.

## What is it?

- JIE 'O' runs in parallel with the main JAE application window
- For students to apply to full-time **3-year *Higher Nitec***
- Posting to a course is based on the **aggregate score of best 5 GCE 'O' subjects, including CCA bonus points** where applicable and is subject to availability of vacancy. Applicants may choose up to a maximum of **12 choices**

- Click on "For GCE 'O' Level Holders (JIE 'O')" under "Full-Time 3-Year *Higher Nitec* Courses (Jan 2026 Intake)"

- Interviews are only applicable to applicants who have applied for courses under Aptitude-Based Admissions and are shortlisted for interview



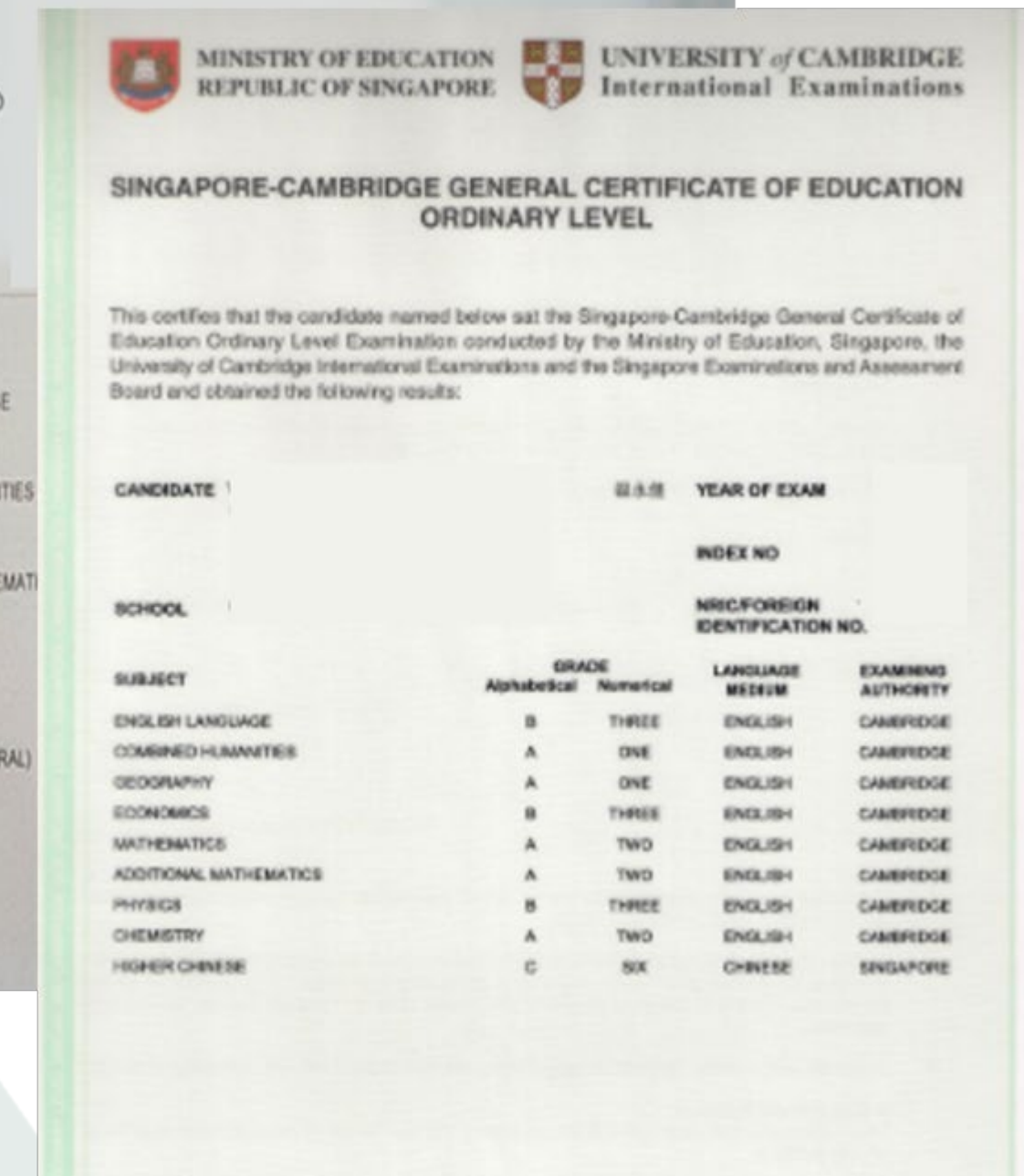

# JAE Posting Procedure

JAE Posting is based on:

## Net Aggregate Score

- **Net** score = **Gross** score (Form A) **minus** **bonus points**

## Course Choices and Order

## Vacancies Available in the Courses

## Number of Applicants and Their Scores

!

- **Academic Merit** is the first criterion.
- Applicants with **Better Net Score** will be considered for admission **first**.
- This is then followed by order of course choices by the applicant, subject to vacancies remaining.

### **Note:**

**Priority** is given to **eligible applicants** (based on MER) who chose NYP or NP's **Diploma in Nursing** as **FIRST choice**

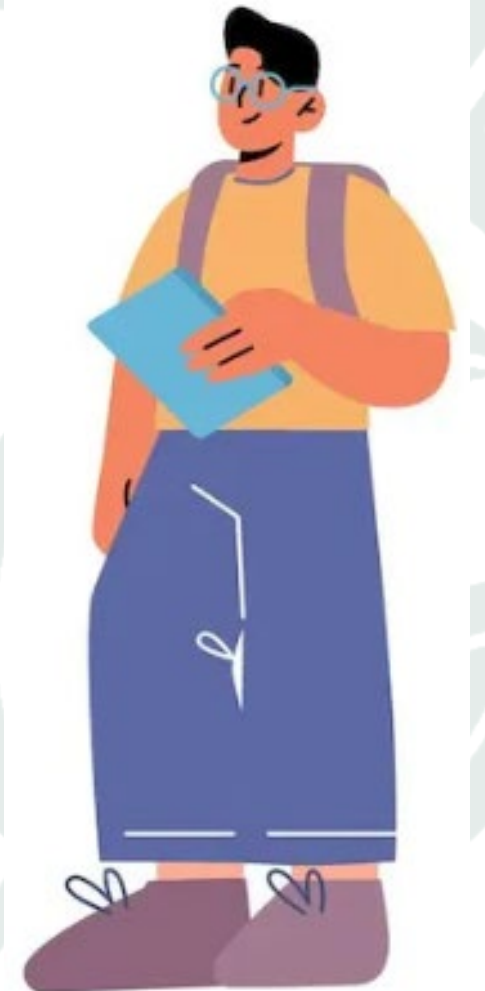

**Jane is considered for posting first to ASRJC**

Based on Jane's net aggregate score (10 pts) being lower than John's score (11 pts), and this is despite ranking ASRJC as 3rd choice as compared to John's 1st choice.

- At end of combined appeals period, **all unposted students will be offered a place** in a polytechnic or ITE course with **remaining vacancies**, subject to the aforesaid conditions

# Direct Admissions Exercise (DAE)

- Refer to the various polytechnic websites for information on eligibility and requirements
- Application is to be made directly via the polytechnic websites
- Two phases. Phase 1 coincides with JAE application period. Phase 2 will be around end-February
- Some polytechnics **do not accept** applicants who are **eligible** to apply for polytechnic courses **via JAE**
- Placement is **NOT guaranteed** i.e. not a “back-up” option. Do participate in JAE



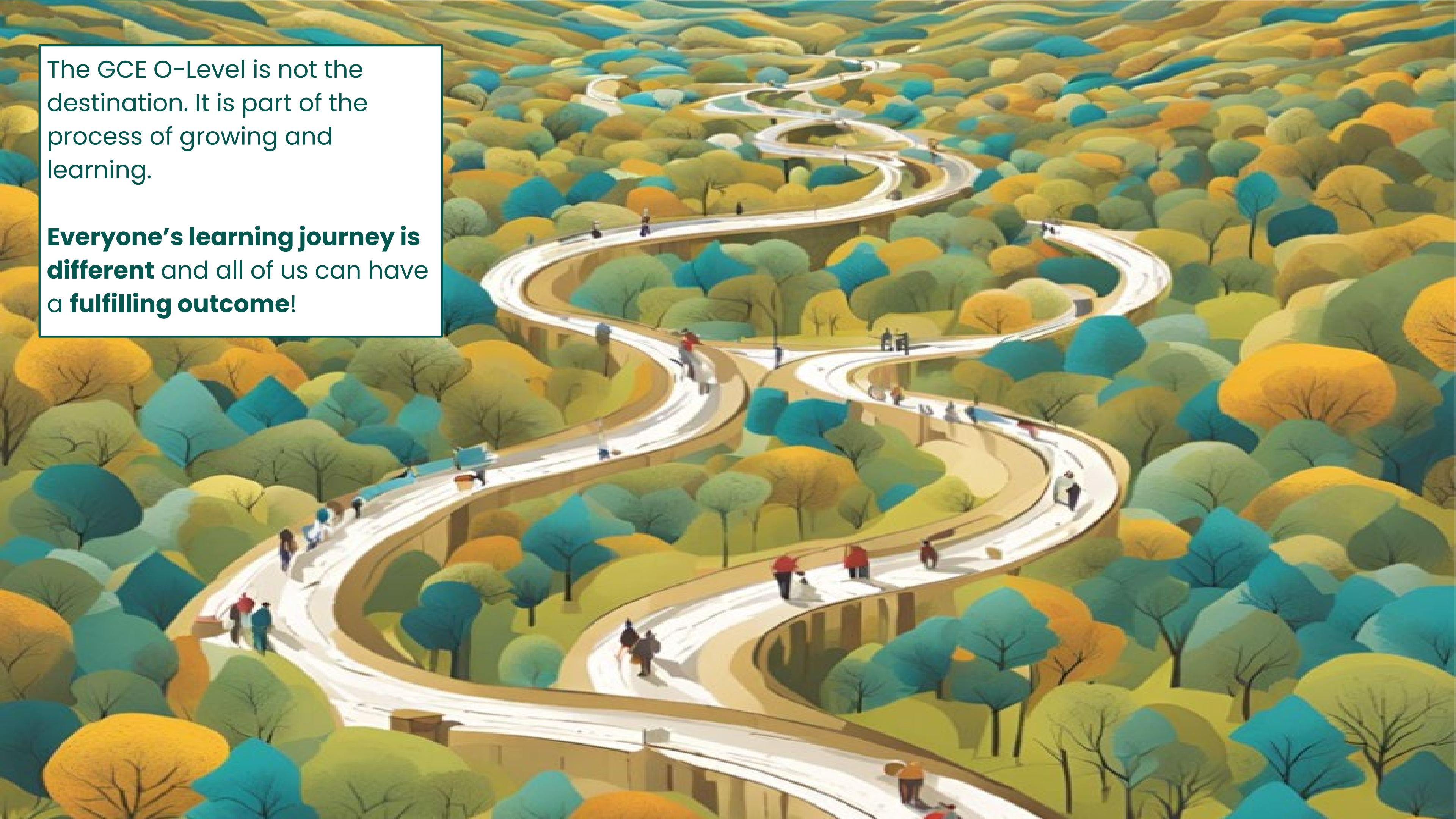

# Maximise Your 12 Choices

Note that JAE and JIE 'O' are **two separate admission exercises** running in parallel.



## **Passion Basket**

### **First 3 – 4 Choices**

Consider courses that **most align** with your Values, Interests, Personality & Skills (V.I.P.S) and strengths.



## **Practical Basket**

### **Next 4 Choices**

Choose courses you are **interested in** and stand a **good chance in securing**. (where your net score is **within** the range of the last year's aggregate score).



## **Prudence Basket**

### **Last 4 Choices**

Include alternative courses and institutions where the latest aggregate scores are **higher** than yours. With this, your chances of securing a place will be higher.

# Polytechnic Foundation Programme (PFP)

Students are eligible to apply for the PFP if they obtain a raw ELMAB3 aggregate of 12 points or lower and meet the subject-specific requirements for their chosen course.

PFP-eligible students will receive a copy of **Form P**.

Apply through the PFP Admissions Exercise (PFPAE) portal.

**Applications** for the PFP will be open from **1.30pm on Wed, 14 Jan**, to **4.30pm on Mon, 19 Jan**.

The PFP posting **results** will be released at **1.30pm on Mon, 26 Jan** through the PFPAE portal.

Students will need to **accept, reject, or submit an appeal** for another course by **4.30pm on Thu, 29 Jan**. Release of **appeal outcome** on the PFPAE portal from **1.30pm on Wed, 4 Feb**. **Accept or reject** appeal offer from **1.30pm on Wed, 4 Feb** to **4.30pm on Fri, 6 Feb**.

# Direct-Entry-Scheme to Polytechnic Programme (DPP)

Eligible Secondary 4 N(A) students may submit their DPP applications online via the DPP application portal at [www.ite.edu.sg/apply-for-ite-courses](http://www.ite.edu.sg/apply-for-ite-courses).

Applications for the DPP will open from **12.00am on Wed, 14 Jan, to 11.59pm on Mon, 19 Jan.**

The DPP posting results for applications made under the final application phase will be released at **9.00am on Wed, 21 Jan** through the DPP application portal. Students will be notified of your posting result through email and SMS. Accept the offer through the ITE website before the deadline.

On **Mon, 26 Jan**, successful final phase applicants, are to report to ITE for the 10-week DPP preparation course.

# 8 Things You Should Know Before You Enrol in A Private School

## School Registration



Ensure the school is registered with CPE. Review the school's registration period, expiry date and its overall registration track record.

## Partner Institution



Research on the partner institution conferring the diploma or degree, and whether the qualification is recognised by the industry.

## EduTrust Certification Scheme

Is the school EduTrust-certified\*? Under the scheme, private schools are assessed for their performance in areas such as school management and provision of student support services.



*\*Schools are required to obtain EduTrust certification in order to offer external degree programmes*

## School Premises

Head down to the campus ground to check the facilities and support services. Observe the study environment too.



## Fee Protection



Ask if there is any course fee protection so that you will be able to recover unconsumed course fees should the school close down.

## Beyond Course fees



Find out about the course syllabus and materials, graduation rates and employment prospects. Approach the alumni to find out what they think of the school.

## Teachers

Check if the teachers are qualified to teach the course.



## Internship

If industry attachment is included, find out which organisation you will be attached to, the period of attachment and the alternative arrangement should the attachment become unavailable. Verify the information with the organisation as well.
