



How to use this Playbook?

This PLAYBOOK gives you all the resources you need to start working with your child's natural talents and how to groom and use these talents productively in this phase of adolescence.

There are 3 Ways that you can start to work with your child's TALENTS:

- 1) Understand and Affirm your child's talents
- Ponder and Reflect on how your child has used their talents in the past
- 3) Help your child develop a strategy on how they can use their talent to achieve their goals

SUGGESTED ACTIVITY 1: A CONVERSATION WITH YOUR CHILD

SUGGESTED ACTIVITY 3 : WHY IS HE/SHE LIKE THAT?







Support

Have regular and genuine conversations with your child, where you are open to hearing them

Affirm

Show love and support which helps your child grow in confidence

Familiarise

Familiarise yourself with your child's personality and learning style

Empathise

Encourage your child to share with you why he/she makes certain decisions/ choices.






